Completion of a formal plumbing educational program approved by the Committee, consisting of a minimum of one thousand (1,000) classroom hours equals two (2) years of experience.

Completion of a formal plumbing educational program approved by the Committee, consisting of a minimum of five hundred (500) classroom hours equals one (1) year of experience.

Completion of a formal plumbing educational program approved by the Committee, consisting of a minimum of three hundred and seventy-five (375) classroom hours equals three-fourths (3/4) of a year, or nine months of experience.

Completion of a formal plumbing educational program approved by the Committee, consisting of a minimum of three hundred and thirty-four (334) classroom hours equals two-thirds (2/3) of a year, or eight months of experience.

Completion of a formal plumbing educational program approved by the Committee, consisting of a minimum of two hundred and fifty (250) classroom hours equals one-half (1/2) year, or six months of experience.
